Award Description	<p>This HPRP grant provides services to prevent persons and families from becoming homeless as well as to provide services to re-house those who have recently become homeless.</p> <p>A joint program has been created to utilize Hamilton County funds as well as the \$5,339,182 of HPRP funding allocated to the City of Cincinnati. As such, the joint program will have a total budget of \$6,735,803. Nearly 70% of these funds will be used for a Homelessness Prevention program that is designed to provide short-term (up to 3-months) of financial assistance to eligible households. Assistance will be provided through case managers at one of six agencies: the Free Store, the Salvation Army, Mercy Franciscan, St. Vincent de Paul, the Cincinnati Hamilton</p>		

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County Community Action Agency, and Santa Maria Community Services. All participants will be screened:

- a) That homelessness is imminent without the assistance;
- b) To ensure that they are cases that with the limited direct assistance will prevent homelessness; and
- c) That the household meets the 50% AMI criteria.

The participating agency will be required to provide on-going case management and support to the participating household for the three-month period. Assistance may be provided no more than twice during the three-year grant period. The average level of assistance is estimated at \$2000 per case and not to exceed \$2500 per case.

Rapid Re-Housing activities will be restricted to single person households in order to complement a similar program for families that was awarded funding to the Continuum of Care as a part of the 2008 Supportive Housing Program. This component of the program will provide medium-term rental assistance for no more than twelve months. Eligible participants are single individuals from any emergency shelter. The Free Store will provide coordination among the shelters involved. Participants will also receive intensive case management to assist in stabilizing housing, maintaining housing, increasing skills and income, as well as providing attention to any other special needs. Financial assistance may also be provided to cover security deposits, rent and utility assistance, and as needed past due utility or rental payments to the extent that such prohibit a participant from

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being re-housed and within six months of the current date. Rapid Re-Housing program will also include employment of a Benefits Specialist to assist participants in accessing benefits from Social Security and Medicaid that facilitate movement from shelters and permanent housing more rapidly, as well as a Housing Specialist to assist participants in accessing affordable housing and to arrange for inspection of such units to assure habitability. A final part of the Rapid Re-Housing is funding for limited assistance for participants by Legal Aid as appropriate. Over the three-year period of the HPRP grant it is anticipated that 2240 clients will benefit from the Homelessness Prevention services, and the Rapid Re-Housing program will assist 522 individuals. It should be noted that HPRP funds are not eligible to be used to operate or construct shelters for the homeless.

The collaboration among the City, the County and the Continuum of Care is being pursued in order to minimize the administrative costs associated with this effort and to maximize the extent of benefit to the programs? clients. Furthermore, by the City and the County providing these program funds, the United Way and other funders to the participating agencies will be providing the screening and case management services needed to make it a success.

<p>Quarterly Activities/ Project Description</p> <p>Hamilton County Homeless Prevention and Rapid Rehousing Program</p> <p>The Cincinnati/Hamilton County Continuum of Care for the Homeless, Inc. (CoC) is administering the HPRP Programs for Hamilton County and the City of Cincinnati. The CoC has subcontracted with the established community HMIS provider, The Partnership Center, Ltd. to provide all HMIS required activities. The local HMIS system, VESTA, has been reprogrammed to all HUD specifications for reporting including the new HMIS Data and Technical Standards as required for HPRP. VESTA has also been programmed for the required Quarterly Performance Report (QPR) and annual Performance Report (APR) as required by HUD for reporting on HPRP. All HPRP Prevention providers are entering information into one "program" in VESTA, in real-time-- so no applicant could receive services from two separate agencies. HPRP staff is utilizing VESTA as both a case management tool and as a means for financial assistance requests. VESTA is programmed to meet the local HPRP program requirements for financial assistance requests such as receiving and storing scanned leases, eviction notices, disconnect notices, etc. Case workers are entering their case notes and services provided pertaining to housing stabilization into VESTA.
