SAFETY & HEALTH PROGRAM

The Safety Policy of the Board of County Commissioners requires that Department Heads cooperate with the County Risk Manager in the coordination and deployment of safety practices and programs and in implementing measures to enhance employee health and safety. Department Heads must implement any additional or supplemental safety programs and procedures unique to the safe operation of their departments.

The Department of County Facilities has established a Safety & Health Program unique to the safe operation of our department to help prevent occupational injuries and illnesses and comply with federal, state and local safety and health regulations including applicable OSHA 29 CFR 1910 General Industry and 29 CFR 1926 Construction standards, as well as all ANSI, NEC and NFPA standards that are incorporated into the OSHA regulations by reference.

The following supplemental safety programs and procedures are pertinent to our work operations and have been incorporated into the Safety & Health Program:
