

# Hamilton County's Water Quality Management Plan Update

**WHAT** The Ohio-Kentucky-Indiana Regional Council of Governments (OKI) is hosting a public meeting to describe the major findings and recommendations of the draft Hamilton County Water Quality Management Plan and to get feedback from citizens. Water Quality Management Plans are required by the federal Clean Water Act to identify water pollution problems in metropolitan areas and recommend how to address them, while avoiding duplications of effort by local sewer agencies. OKI received a grant through the Ohio EPA to bring the Hamilton County plan up to date, and expects to complete the work by the end of June.
