Hamilton County Planning and Development Floodplain Management Division in conjunction with the Ohio Emergency Management Agency (OEMA) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), has applied for a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) Project under the major disaster declaration (FEMA4360-DR-OH) signed by the President on April 17, 2018.

As a result of the federal disaster declaration, funding has been made available for the Unincorporated Areas of Hamilton County, Ohio to develop a full project application for the areas affected by the recent floods.

The objectives of the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program are to prevent future losses of lives and property, to implement state or local Hazard Mitigation plans, to enable mitigation measures to be implemented during immediate recovery from disaster, and to provide funding for identified and approved hazard mitigation projects.

Hamilton County is seeking property owners that have been repetitively flooded over the past several years including the most recent flooding which took place in February 2018 to attend an Open Public Forum. Interested property owners and/or citizens are invited to attend this meeting to discuss the project, ask questions and what steps are necessary to be part of the voluntary mitigation grant application.
