





Social Contact Referral Process


An individual who meets the eligibility criteria, but who has not committed an offense, may be referred to Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) as a social contact referral




Cincinnati Police Department (CPD) makes contact with individual who may benefit from LEAD. CPD explains LEAD to participant reviews eligibility, and completes Initial Screening Form if person consents.




Initial Screening form sent to Screening and Outreach Coordinator. The form will be reviewed at the next Operation Work Group (OWG) meeting.




If OWG approves of individual for LEAD, CPD coordinates a meeting with Outreach Coordinator and participant.




Screening and Outreach Coordinator will meet with participant at desired location and complete Immediate Needs Screening form.




Participant will be assigned to a case manager. They have 30 days to complete full psychosocial assessment with case manager.



Participant will be admitted into the program once the assessment is complete. Case manager will complete individualized service plan (ISP) and begin addressing needs



ISP and client progress is reviewed by OWG at minimum of 90 days. Plans are updated as needed to reflect changes in needs/progress.



Participant's needs, progress, and service plan are monitored over a 12- month period. Case management will remain in effect as needed and as determined by staff.
