


HAMILTON COUNTY STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT





Grant Scope:

Hamilton County is seeking grant applications for stormwater infrastructure projects that will help mitigate overland flooding and help strengthen stormwater collection systems against increasingly intense rain events. Hamilton County expects to award a total of \$3.3 million in American Rescue Plan Act - State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (ARPA-SLFRF).

Applicants shall certify that each project submitted is a necessary investment in water or sewer infrastructure as defined in ARPA-SLFRF and all applicable guidance.

A "necessary" Investment in infrastructure must be:

- 1. Responsive to an identified need to achieve or maintain an adequate minimum level of service, which may include a reasonable projection of increased need, whether due to population growth or otherwise
- 2. A cost-effective means of meeting that need, taking into account available alternatives.

Note: Projects eligible under the EPA's Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) are generally presumed to be necessary investments.

List of Priority Projects:

- Projects providing relief to structures in areas historically inundated with overland stormwater flow during rain events.
- Projects providing relief to pockets of known prone single family or commercial buildings that have frequently experienced water in basement that has been determined not to be resulting from MSD lack of sewer capacity.

Ineligible Costs:

- Funding is not intended for the creation of new developments.
- Funds may not be used for indirect costs, profit, insurance expenses, or overhead costs or expenses outside of those directly related to the requested project. Any requests for personnel costs should be kept to a minimum and only for costs directly related to the grant request.
- Funds may not be deposited into any pension funds.
- Funds may not be used for debt service and/or replenishment for rainy day funds.
- Funds may not be used to satisfy settlements and/or judgements.
- Funds may not be used for purposes that contravene or violate the American Rescue Plan Act, Uniform Guidance, conflicts of interest, and other federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- Funds may not be used for any ineligible uses for Federal Funds as detailed in 2 CFR 200.



This grant program is funded through ARPA-SLFRF. It is anticipated that any public entities awarded grant funding under this program will be considered subrecipients of Federal funds. As such, applicants must be able to comply with all requirements of such designation including adherence to all rules and regulations outlined within the US Department of Treasury Final Rule.

Any public entity that receives ARPA-SLFRF payments hereunder agrees that it will only submit for reimbursement, those costs that comply with the language of the ARPA-SLFRF Final Rule, any Guidance, and Frequently Asked Questions and Answers issued by the federal government or State of Ohio, which includes without limitation, U.S. Treasury, Office of Inspector General, the Ohio Auditor of State and the Ohio Office of Budget and Management ("Eligible Expenses"). Jurisdictions should review the Final Rule and Frequently Asked Questions and are cautioned that later versions may become available.

In addition, the receipt and review of source documentation as well as the payment of funding by the Board to a public entity shall in no way be construed as Board's determination or approval of the eligibility of the expenses being reimbursed. In all cases and under all circumstances, the jurisdiction is ultimately responsible for the determination of the eligibility of expenses that it submits to the Board for payment.

All applications will be reviewed for completeness and eligibility. If demand for this funding exceeds the applicable allocation(s), funding will be distributed, in a manner deemed appropriate by the Board.

Eligibility:

- The Applicant must be a public entity able to enter into a grant agreement with Hamilton County.
- Eligible public entities include municipalities, townships, county agencies, and other local government organizations.
- The Applicant must agree to maintain and operate the completed project long term.
- The Applicant is responsible for managing all aspects of operation to include, contract administration, project implementation, site maintenance, and other requirements of the applicant.
- Requests for design assistance to get project shovel ready are allowed so long as timelines can be met.
- Plans must be designed by a certified professional engineer.

Selection Process:

Applicants must complete the ARPA-SLFRF Grant Application Form and provide all required documentation with the application by specified deadlines. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.

Hamilton County will review and evaluate all applications based on the evaluation criteria outlined below. All organizations recommended to Hamilton County Board of County Commissioners for a grant award must comply with all local, state, and federal rules, regulations, and procedures applicable to this Grant. Awarded grantees will be required to enter into a Grant Agreement, in a form satisfactory to the Board of County Commissioners.
